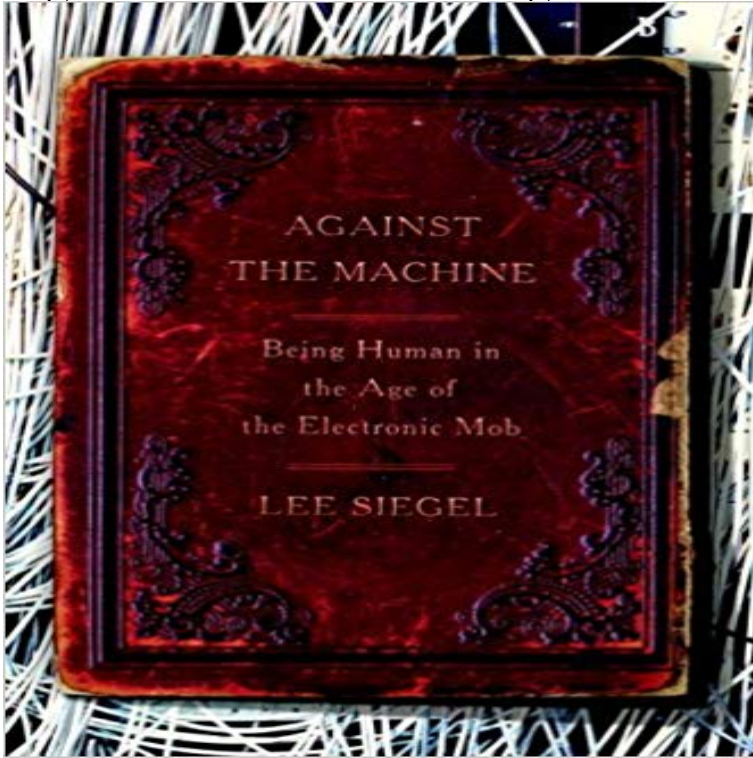


## Against the Machine: Being Human in the Age of the Electronic Mob
