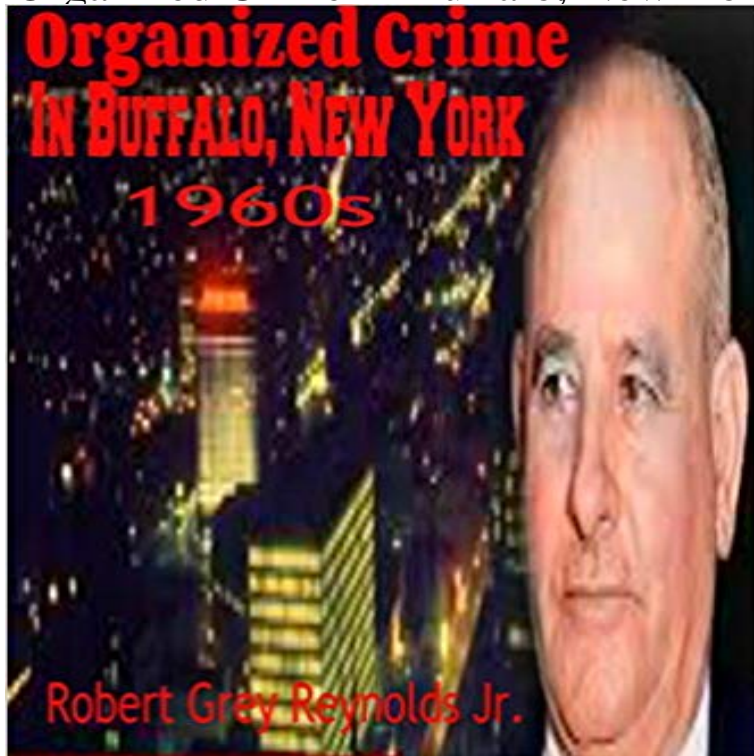


Organized Crime In Buffalo, New York (1960s)
