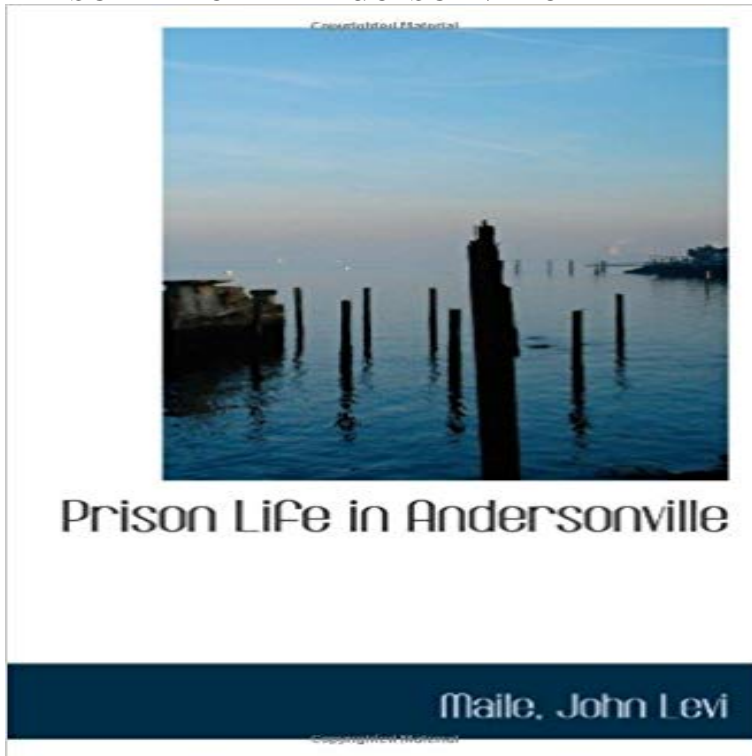


## Prison Life in Andersonville
