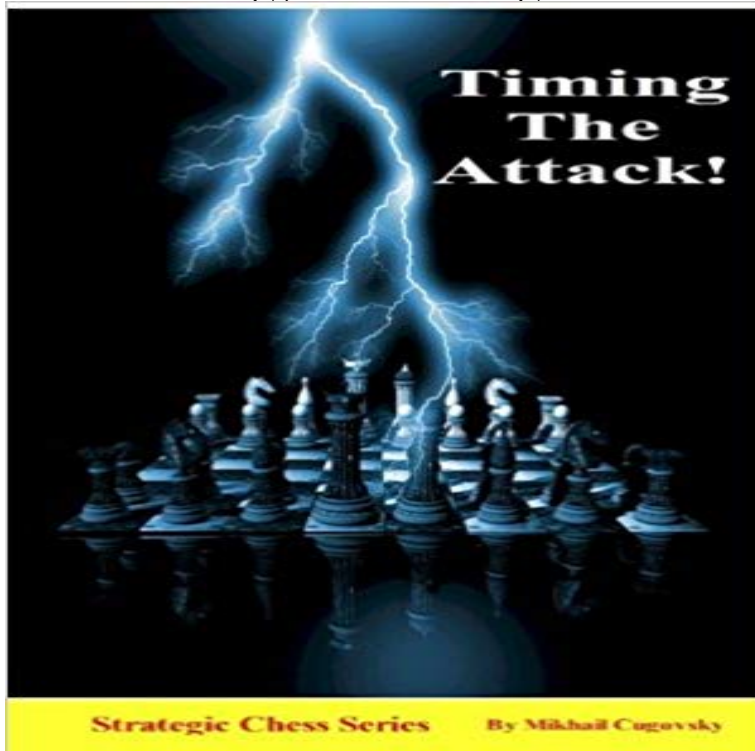


Chess Strategy #6 - Timing The Attack! (Chess Strategy Series)
