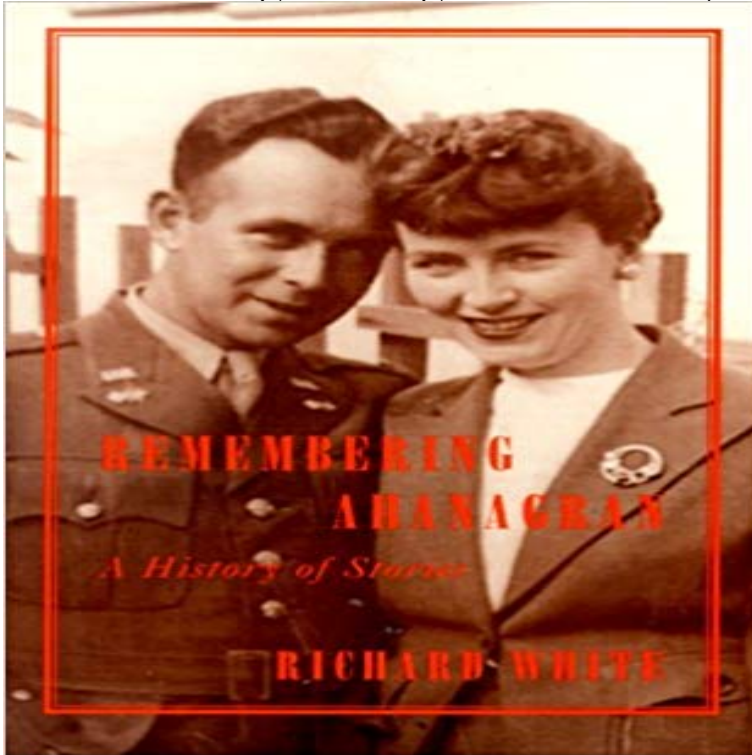


Remembering Ahanagan: A History of Stories
